

#### **The Messenger Receives New Lottery Funding**

The production team are delighted to announce that they have been advised of the award of a grant from the New Opportunities Fund under the Awards for All scheme.

£3965 will be used next year mainly to purchase a high throughput laser printer with double sided printing facilities.

This will improve the quality of the newsletter reproduction and will get the Messenger on the streets, probably a day quicker than previously.



The funds will also allow us to update our DTP software and other image processing equipment.
