





## Auchenblae Pre-School Group

Calling all parents of children under 5 years of age... Auchenblae Pre-School Group are offering a unique opportunity to visit one of their sessions and learn all about how the Playgroup, 2s Group, and Toddler sessions run.



At the beginning of the new term, the Group will be holding its first Open Day/Induction Day. The usual Playgroup session that morning will be cancelled and replaced with this very special session for all children in this age group to attend with their parents. One of the aims of this session will be to go through much of the information parents need to know to enable the sessions, and the Group, to run smoothly and efficiently. It is important that all parents of children enrolled for next Session attend the Open Day/Induction Day. The provisional date arranged is the 20<sup>th</sup> August, please make arrangements to attend with your child for this date. The session will also offer parents interested in sending their children to the Group a chance to see what we can offer. 
