NEW LOGO COMPETITION



Without the shop many of us would

have had a hard time of it this winter. Trade was good during the bad spell but has it kept up?

Can you imagine Auchenblae without its shop? It would become a deserted village - no pub., no butcher's shop, no coffee shop, no newspapers or magazines, no food, no household commodities, no pensions - NOTHING!

There are many here who do not have cars at the door, or are too elderly or infirm to avail themselves of the bus service to Stonehaven or Laurencekirk and would have to depend on kind neighbours to shop for them if they do not have any family members living near enough to help. There wouldn't

be enough room at Queen Elizabeth Court in Fettercairn for them all!

It is up to all of us who live in this lovely village to do all we can to keep the shop open and thriving. Could we all maybe make fewer trips to the supermarkets? Might we cut down a bit on our tesco.com or asda.com shopping and buy more items locally?

People from Drumlithie would also be worse off if our shop has to close. There is at present no shop there and folk have to drive over to Auchenblae for newspapers, stamps etc. or take the bus to Stonehaven.

Come on, Auchenblae, let's rally round and like the Guides and Scouts, do our best to keep our village alive!

Jane and Hugh come over the top from Inverbervie to provide the service, and did so throughout the really appalling winter. They provide full Post Office services. There is a banking service. You can pay in cheques and withdraw money. It is possible to order your foreign currency there, without charge. Both Jane and Hugh are very friendly and very helpful.

They worry that not many people seem to use the service. Remember, if we don't use it we could lose it and it is so much better than having to carry everything to Stonehaven or Laurencekirk to post. Come on folks. Don't let us lose another service through neglect.




