The amount has not yet been confirmed by Fred Olsen, the developer but is likely to be in the region of £30,000 plus a £4,000+ carry over from this year.

evening light,


As across the Mearns homely

Come along and do your bit:



Auchenblae Village Hall warmer already!

Thanks to a generous grant from the Midhill fund and sterling efforts from Sandy Noble organising surveys & getting quotes & ensuring the work was done, our lovely hall is now fully fitted with secondary double glazing. This discrete fitting ensures that the façade of the hall is not compromised and the units can be opened easily for cleaning.

This installation is the first stage in insulating the hall and the effects should be noticeable for anyone attending a function. The Community Association will be monitoring the electricity consumption to see the effects. Another grant application will be made this year to enable us to carry out further insulation work.


