MEARNS COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The general purpose of a Community Council is to ascertain, to co-ordinate and express to the local authorities the views of the community which it represents....and to take such action in the interests of the community as appears to it to be expedient and practicable.

Mearns Community Council has representatives from Auchenblae, Drumlithie, Fettercairn (including Edzell Woods) Fordoun, Laurencekirk, Lathermuir and Marykirk. It meets monthly and deals with any correspondence (usually about 20 letters per month), planning applications, and each settlement has the opportunity to raise issues pertinent to them. There is usually a presentation made to the Community Council, and this may be a Council Official with a specific responsibility - roads, education, planning etc., or an individual or group who have an issue they wish to speak about, which may be for or against a particular issue.

Community Councils as the elected body closest to local people can play a major role in ensuring decision making remains as close to those concerned as is practicable.

The main purpose however, is for Community Councillors to represent the views of their communities. These might not be their own personal views but preference must be given to the view of the community.

Community Councillors can also represent the Council on various committees or take responsibility for a particular topic such as planning or health.

Auchenblae Community Councillors are asked to raise issues by many members of the community - not all are reported in the local press, but everything is acted upon by the Community Council. Local Councillors attend meetings and can often take specific issues on board and deal with them very quickly.


We're planning on doing a sponsored walk in May. If you are interested in taking part, sponsorship forms will be available at Tracey's coffee morning.

You may have recently witnessed the curious sight of a group of Pre-School Group children progressing through the village in crocodile-like fashion attached to a brightly coloured contraption and ushered by adults wearing equally garish fluorescent jackets. The contraption in question is called a 'walk-a-dile' and is designed to keep young children safe when out and about. Up to six children can clip on to a unit and progress along together, thus making it much easier for the adults to keep an eye on them and to prevent a child straying out into the road.



The playleaders can now direct their energies to pointing out things of interest to the children, rather than constantly reminding them to keep together.

13 - 19 MAY 2007

The Ball is now rolling for our annual drive in West Mearns to show - as we have done for the past ten years - that this is one part of the world where we really do care about what's happening in some of the poorer parts of the planet.

But one of the problems we face in this neck of the woods is partly of our own making. We have done so well in the past that we are now expected to keep on building on the foundation we have been laying these past ten years! And, incredibly, some of us who have been with Christian Aid right from when we started this fund-raising activity are actually getting older!

What keeps us going is the knowledge that there are agencies on the ground who really know the score when it comes to stark human need and who depend on the kind of financial assistance that helps them enable people to stand on their own feet - and that's what we're about. Of course Christian Aid is there -and has always been there for the past fifty years and more when it comes to the big disasters that make the headlines, but in over 60 different countries there are men, women and children who are being lifted out of poverty in ways that make them no longer dependent on aid from the wealthy nations. **And one of the most significant things about Christian Aid is that it comes with no strings - religious, political or other, attached.** It isn't reserved for people of any religious persuasion, and it's only called "Christian" aid because *that is the quality of the aid that's on offer.*

HOW THE *MESSENGER* REACHES YOU

Submitted on behalf of the many hands that ensure *The Messenger* keeps going.

1. **Contributors**, any person or group in the village, write their articles and get them to the Editor for the month. The Editor's name is intimated in the *Memo* the previous month and by a notice at the Post Office by the 15th of the month before publication e.g. articles for June should be turned in by May 15th. The editors are busy people who haven't the time to phone round all the people who might have something to say, so it's up to everyone to remember that date. They prefer to be given information in electronic format, but will accept typed or written articles from those who are not computer buffs.
2. The Editor does the editing, which takes many hours.
3. The edited articles are passed to one of the Publishers to do the layout - which takes more time.
4. The layout proof is corrected and returned to the Publisher who completes the final copy of the finished *Messenger*.
5. This copy is then passed on to the printer who produces 375 collated *Messengers*.
6. The finished copies are then delivered to the person who splits them up into districts and takes them to the Distributors (13 in all) and to the Post Office and shops for collection there.
7. The distributors drop their copies in the letter boxes when they find the time to do it.

The Aim is that the *Messengers* will all be delivered before the end of the month prior to that for which the information is relevant. It can be done so long as there are no hiccups along the way!

MEARNS COMMUNITY TRANSPORT SCHEME

The Mearns Area Partnership applied for funding in 2005 and was granted a three year award which paid for a new minibus, a transport co-ordinator and admin. assistant. The bus arrived last year and has already been well used by local groups and by Mearns Academy. The bus seats 15 plus driver and is available to all groups in the area. At present most provide their own driver who must have passed the Aberdeenshire Council driving test. There is a pool of volunteer drivers who are willing to drive for groups.
