Auchenblae Gardens Open Weekend July 16th and 17th.

To celebrate the 10th anniversary of our Gardens Open event we are to stretch the boundaries somewhat to include a couple of 'out of town' gardens.

Donald and Sue Barrie have offered us the unique chance to visit their home at Glensaugh Lodge where we can wander through the garden they have been restoring over the last 15 years.

The upper garden contains a mixture of herbaceous perennials and shrubs and on a lower level we will find the productive kitchen garden, fruit trees and the working polytunnel.

In summer Sue harvests, freezes, pickles and jams much of the produce, as well as looking after guests staying in the holiday apartment which she operates in one wing of the Lodge.

The work at Glensaugh Lodge is very much a family affair with youngsters Eliza and Adam getting stuck in to help their Mum and Dad in this extensive project.

Nearer to home lies another interesting garden, at Crann-Tara adjacent to Glenfarquhar Lodge. Previously an accommodation block for the Templehill Community, the house had lain empty for several years before Margaret Pitt and Roy Vobes moved in.

During the first three years their work was concentrated on removing "every weed known to man" from what was meant to be the garden. Since then they have converted two paddocks into magnificent grounds filled with herbaceous borders, cut-out beds, bushes, heathers, perennial plants as well as a wild flower area and woodland.

There will be lots more interesting things to see, both at Glensaugh and Crann-Tara, but we must keep some surprises for the weekend!

Collect your entry tickets, which are priced at £7.00 and include delicious Strawberry Teas, from the village hall. Gardens will be open from 1pm and 4pm on both Saturday and Sunday and you are welcome to spread your visit over two days. Transport will be on hand if required.


