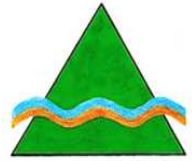

Fact : Millie Knight paralympian skier is visually impaired after contracting a disease called toxoplasmosis as a child , this is caused by a child ingesting the larvae of roundworms from dog or cat faeces if the animal has not been wormed. Closer to home Vikki Sinclair from Fettercairn lost part of the sight in one eye due to this, her Mum said she was a thumb sucking child even when out playing and doctors said that was probable cause. About 100 children a year lose some sight due to toxoplasmosis , so it's not just smelly mess of shoes that's a problem if dog owners don't pick up after their pet.

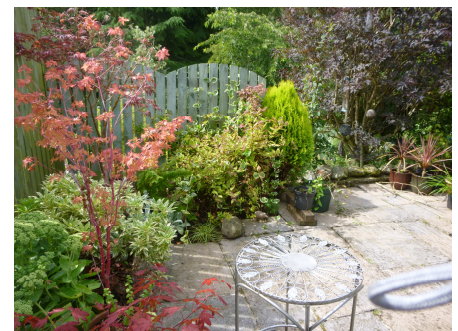

I want to donate my hair to make a wig for another child who doesn't have a choice like me because of illness.

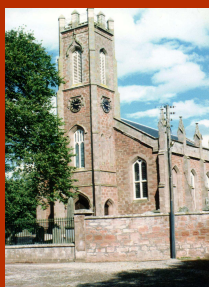
I hope by doing this I will be able to raise some money for research. I want cancer to be beaten and I'm sure we can all do it - with a bit of your help.
