The activity net in the kiddie's play area has certainly proved popular and the outdoor gym provides a welcome fitness facility for teenagers and adults. Instruction boards will be erected soon so that each piece of equipment can be used to full advantage.

May we suggest that anyone using the Den, particularly visitors, makes a small donation towards the upkeep of the area, either via the collection pole at the car park, or the honesty box at the pavilion? This would be appreciated.

We hate to bring this subject up again as we are well aware that most dog owners are rigidly responsible, but the den groundsman is finding certain areas most unpleasant to strim. 

