It is very much regrettable that we have lost the full-time Sub Post Offices following the two public consultations. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Singer for the service she has provided Auchenblae over the past thirteen years.

Following the Post Office's decision to cut the service to a part-time outreach the Metelski's have agreed to host the service in their shop on Kintore Street. I wish them well in this task.

On a more positive note, the Government's decision to retain the Post Office Card Account is a victory for the many loyal Post Office users who campaigned so strongly to retain this service. I would like to thank everyone who supported the Post Office in this campaign. I would be keen to hear from users of any difficulties they have with the card account as the Government do have a track record of pressing people against their will into moving to bank accounts.

With all good wishes for a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year from all at Mearns Community Council.





The year started with our Annual Work Day in the Den. Those who joined the committee, worked very hard laying new bark in the adventure playground; tidying up the paths; removing branches and scrub; rolling the tennis courts; tidying the roses in the old dam; burning brushwood and cutting up logs.

The Den looked fantastic for those who came to celebrate the 'Opening Day' on the 26th of April.

The Tennis Club has a membership of 74, predominately juniors who are being trained by Wendy Byres, a registered LTA coach. We're grateful to Gina, Carol and Margo who organize these weekly sessions and give of their time and effort to keep this club running.

The Den continues to improve under the careful eye of Roy and Bill. When tree surgery or fabrication work is required, Bernie Mel-som willingly comes to our assistance. Thank you Bernie.

The committee has just planted bulbs donated by Geo. Gammie of Cairnton - we can confirm that there are many, many bulbs in a bag!! Look out for them in the dam area in the spring.

The football pitch is now being cut on a regular basis by Ann Galbraith, and we hope to get it marked and new nets in place for next season. We also hope to make further paths for dog walkers through the surrounding area. The hundreds of spindly saplings planted by George Dey twenty years ago have grown into a thriving woodland and wild life habitat.

The golf course is a tremendous asset to the village, with the revenue subsidizing all other recreation areas. We have a membership of 465 and a healthy waiting list of 83. Included are 46 junior members, who were offered instruction by Ken Marvelley, a golf course member and professional coach. The youngsters who went to Ken's classes learnt so much and we are grateful to him for giving his services free of charge.

This year we built the long anticipated machinery store to house our valuable equipment. We are grateful to Kenny the green keeper for keeping the course looking so good and to Susan and Jackie for making our members and visitors welcome.

Planning Application for seven Town Houses on former site of Auchenblae Motors - the 28 letters of objection have forced a hearing at the Aberdeenshire Council , Kincardineshire and Mearns Committee Meeting on 18th November 08. A case was presented at the meeting by David Forbes on behalf of village residents opposed to the application who are concerned that the proposed scheme is over developed and out of character with this historic area of the village thus putting the village application for Conservation Area Status at risk. **Councilors voted not to approve the application at the meeting but to move to a site visit date to be advised.**

AUCHENBLAE SURGERY

Some morning appointments are now available to book in advance although there is still the option of open surgery. Auchenblae Post Office

Wednesday 12th November saw the end of a full time post office in Auchenblae. It is quite fitting that the last customer to be served was Elizabeth, who has been sub-postmistress for some 13 years.

The post office was not always on this site, in the 1920's it was run by Alec and Mina Gove in premises where Jade House now sits. 1930's it was in Edward's shop, where Metelski's is now. It then moved to West Brae, opposite The Hollies, where it was run by Len Harvey who also had a drapery/hardware shop.

Next it went to a site where the public toilets are now, run by the McLennan's who formerly had the Drumtochty Arms Hotel. The last postmaster on this site was Dan Farquhar. This premises was demolished in the 1960's to build what is now McKenzie Avenue.

In April 1966 the post office moved to its final location. It was run by Angus and Ruby Coull until 1994, since when, apart from about 6 months it has been run by Elizabeth.

The village is fortunate in that an alternative service is being provided by Inverbervie post office.

We wish Elizabeth a long and happy retirement.

Grampian Fire and Rescue Service



‘We all want to be warm in winter, especially at home, but we must avoid tragedy’, that’s the message from Grampian Fire and Rescue Service this winter. Dusting off an ancient electric fire from the attic or pulling out an old electric blanket may not be good enough if you want to be safe and warm. Each year in the U.K. over 1000 fires are caused by electric blankets and some of these result in death and injury.

When you buy an electric blanket, make sure it carries the British Electrotechnical Approvals Board (BEAB) or the British Standard BSEN 60967. Keep electric blankets dry and flat and have them serviced every two to three years by the manufacturer. If neglected, electric blankets will become a serious risk. Always follow manufacturer’s instructions.

Always make sure you switch off the under-blanket before you get into bed and unplug it. Some over-blankets may be safely left on – check the instructions.

Have your blanket inspected at least every three years by the makers or more often if they recommend it. Some local councils also provide this service free or at a nominal cost.

Many people think that having a fire is something that won’t happen to them. Unfortunately, firefighters know differently, we see people who suffer because of house fires.

We want people to take just a little more care to prevent typical winter fires involving heaters.

- Electric heaters must be fitted with the right fuse, which should be stated in the manufacturer’s guide. The guard must prevent children or clothes coming into contact with the heating source. Cables should not be frayed or damaged, and don’t lay them under rugs or carpets where they can be walked on and damaged. Don’t trail the leads across the floor where someone may trip over them and pull over the fire at the same time. If you find any damage, or aren’t sure about the fuse or wiring, get a qualified electrician to advise you.
- If you have central heating, ensure the boiler is regularly serviced.
- Chimneys used for open fires need regular sweeping to prevent a build-up of soot which can easily catch light and may spread inside the roof.
- Portable gas heaters should be well maintained and checked over by a qualified gas engineer periodically.
- If a leak of gas is detected all naked lights and cigarettes should be extinguished, the cylinder should be turned off at the main valve and removed to the outside. The heater should then be serviced and repaired.
- Cylinders should be changed in the open air if possible
- Spare cylinders should be stored outside, protected from frost and direct sunlight.
- All portable heaters should always be secured in position to prevent them accidentally being knocked over when in use.
- Always use a fireguard and never leave a heater unattended, especially when there are children about. A child’s skin is very sensitive to heat. Children should not be left in a room with an unguarded fire.

Many people think that the noise of a fire and the smell of smoke will alert them, but it doesn’t always work out that way. In fact, if a fire starts while you are asleep, the effects of the smoke could mean that you would never know a thing about it.

Everyone should have working smoke alarms which are tested weekly.

Most DIY and Hardware stores stock timers which can be used in conjunction with lights and radios within the home to give the impression that the house is occupied.

Ensure that sheds and outbuildings are locked and secured to avoid thefts of any valuable equipment.

Report any suspicious people, or vehicles, to Grampian Police on 0845 600 5 700, and please keep a friendly look out for your neighbours, particularly the elderly.

With the temperatures dropping, give yourself plenty of time for your journey and during adverse weather, do not travel unless you really have to. If in doubt, call 0900 3401199 for road conditions.
