# Auchenblae Friendship Group

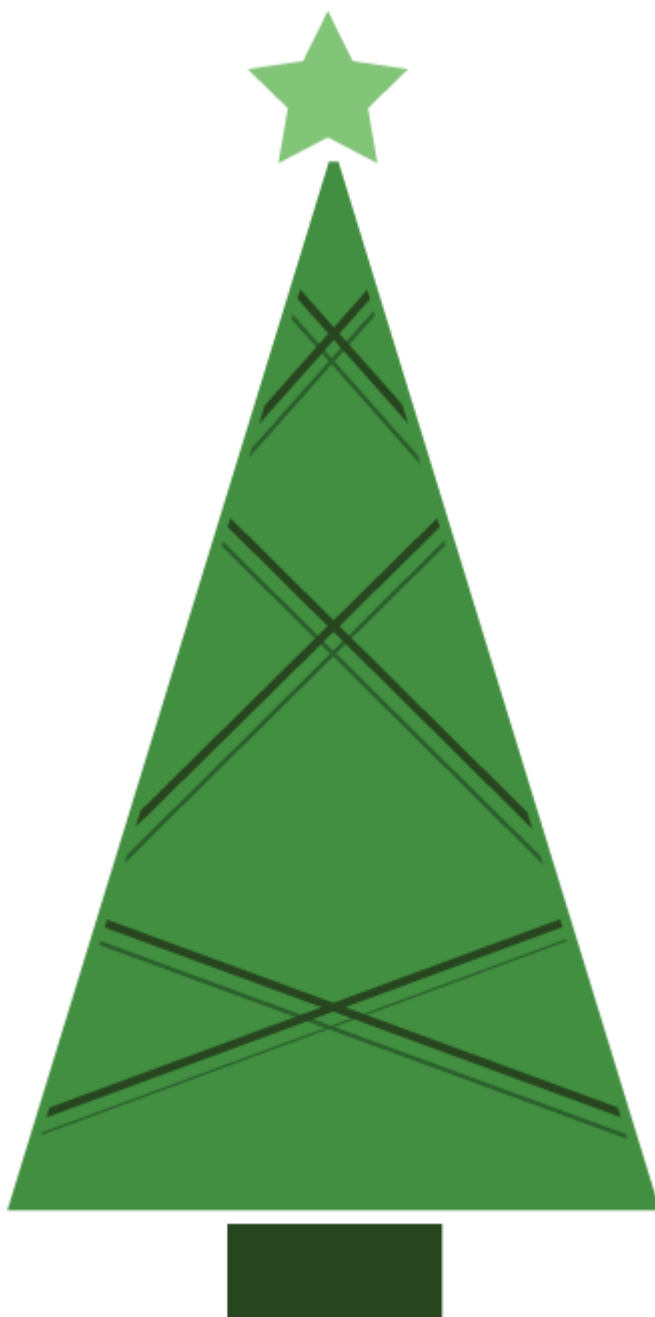

On Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> November, the latest Nearly New Sale was held at the Village Hall by Isabelle Riddoch and Gillian Milne. With the help and support of a group of friends, the girls have been running these sales in Auchenblae since 2007. This year, they have finally decided to hang up their hats as their own children are growing older and the time is right to pass the sale on to a new, younger group of organisers.

Over the last 8 years, the girls have run 21 sales and raised almost £21,000 for various local and national charities. In addition to raising cash for charity, the sales allow families to recycle and purchase a vast array of good quality nearly new items for very competitive prices. The sale fully supports the concept of re-using and re-cycling.

Over the years the charities supported have ranged from national charities such as; Multiple Sclerosis Society, Motor Neurone Disease Scotland, Cancer Research UK to more local charities such as: Archie Foundation, Maggie's Centre, Cash for Kids, Fighting for Sight, Aberdeen Royal Infirmary. The girls have also made donations of resources and cash to all the village groups over the years including both

Laurencekirk and Auchenblae Primary Schools, Auchenblae Nursery and Pre-School Group, the local Scout and Guide groups, the OAP Christmas Lunch fund and the Church clock appeal, to name but a few.



For this final sale, the chosen charity was SNAC; Scottish Network for Arthritis in Children. JIA (Juvenile Idiopathic Arthritis) affects about one in every thousand under 16s yet most people don't even know that

kids can get arthritis. SNAC was set up by parents of kids with JIA to provide support and information for families affected by the condition. Three families in the village have children who suffer from the condition. Isabelle and Gillian have thoroughly enjoyed running the sales and are very proud to have been able to raise this amount of money to support local and national charities, which have all meant something to them personally or to those close to them. They would like to thank all the helpers who have supported them in their venture over the years, without whose help the sales would not have been possible

It is hoped that the sales will continue to run in the village under the stewardship of new organisers and Isabelle and Gillian would like to wish them all the very best for the future.

## **Adverse Weather**

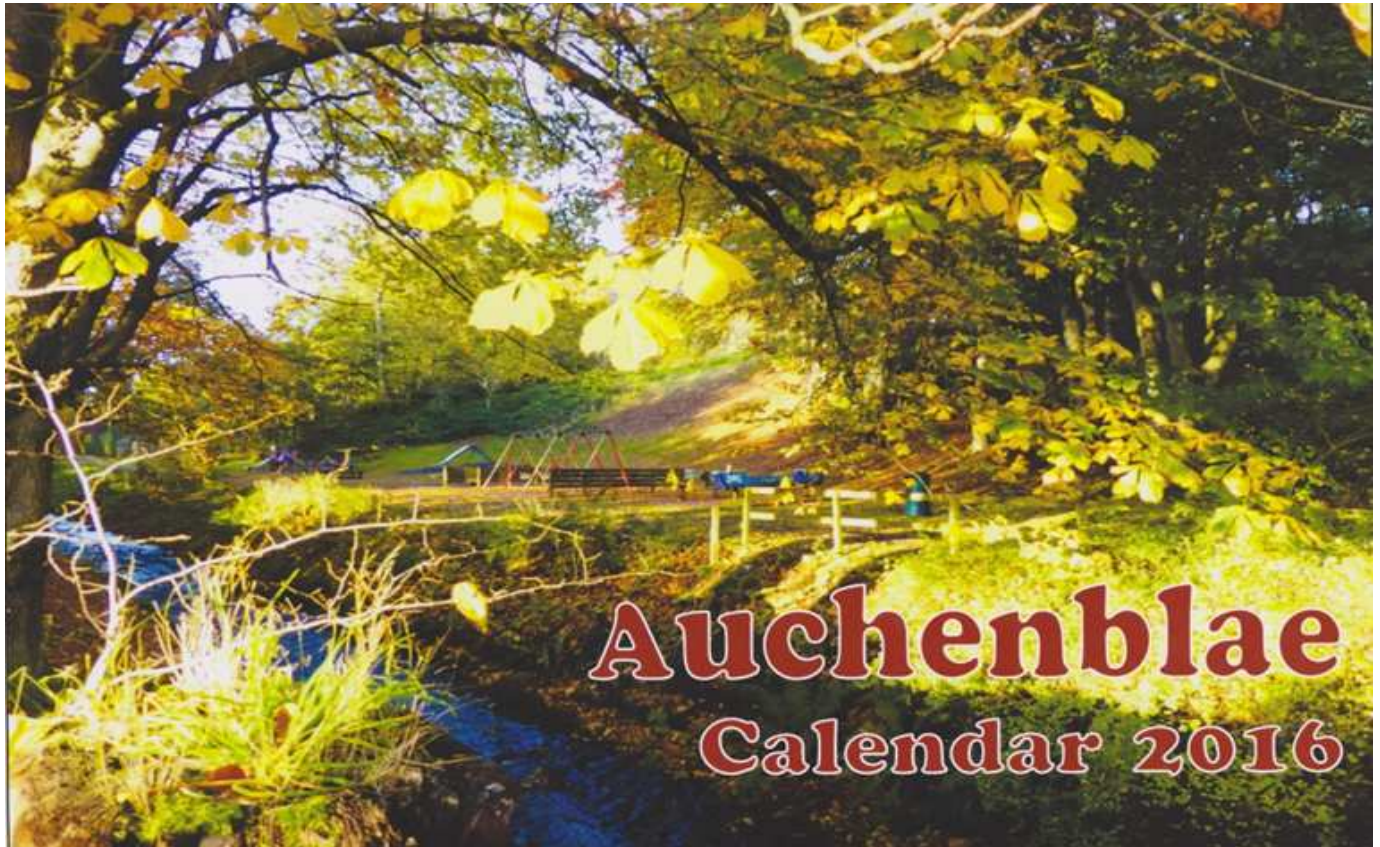

## UPDATE ON THE CHURCH CLOCK

I have to say that I've never known a project that has triggered so much local interest, as when one of the clock faces was ripped from the church tower during January's gale force winds.

Amazingly the copper dial was still intact, but the supporting framework was in a sorry state.

In the interest of public safety, the two remaining faces had to be removed immediately.

On inspection at ground level it was clear that the numerals on the dials were almost illegible. This, along with the cost of their reinstatement on the tower was to be an expensive project and would entail huge fundraising

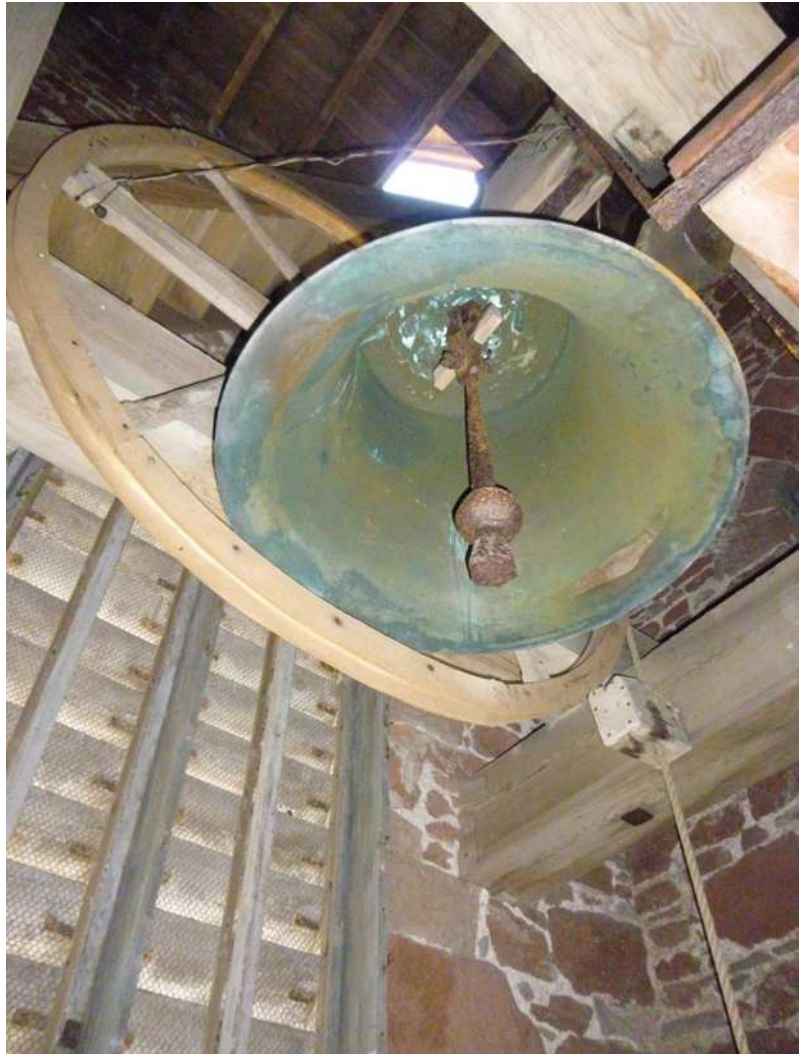
However, the ambitious Silent Auction in May and Gardens Open Weekend in August were greatly supported, giving funds an excellent kick start, making the goal less daunting.

In addition to the generosity of local people, we have received so much unexpected help from others no longer in the area, but who still feel a strong connection with Auchenblae. We were completely overwhelmed as donations flooded in from throughout Scotland; England; and even from America and Canada. It would be unfair to single out particular names, so to one and all, a heartfelt THANK YOU from Auchenblae. To date a staggering £9,099 has been raised.

The fabric convener of our church has wisely decided that while the necessary scaffolding is in place, repairs should be made to any damaged sections of pointing on the tower itself. This is a specialised job using lime mortar befitting the age of the building and is scheduled to start next April. Although everyone is anxious to see the clocks back in place, we will need to exercise a little more patience until springtime.

I previously showed photographs taken inside the tower of the clock mechanism. This time I thought it might be of interest to see the massive bell itself.

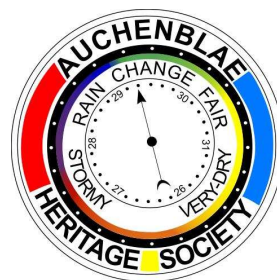

Queen Elizabeth is Patron of Girlguiding .

Everyone in Girlguiding has been given a cloth or metal badge to celebrate her becoming our longest serving monarch.

Princess Elizabeth's parents wanted her and her younger sister Princess Margaret to have as normal a childhood as possible so the 1st Buckingham Palace Guide Company was formed , and the princesses enrolled, Elizabeth , aged 11 as a Guide and Margaret , aged 7 as a Brownie . The company had a total of 20 Guides and 14 Brownies made up from the children of court officials and palace employees. They turned the palace summerhouse into their HQ ,Princess Elizabeth tried campfire cooking , pitching tents and badge work , her badges included cook, child nurse, needle woman and interpreter.

In 1943 she became a Sea Ranger and passed her boating permit and served as coxswain .

In 1946 she became Chief Ranger of The British Empire.

She has always shown a keen interest in how Guiding has developed over the years without losing its core values.

Ranger Guides celebrate their centenary next year and all sections of Girlguiding will have special challenge badges to work for. If anyone in Auchenblae was a Ranger we would love to record your memories , on something called a Podcast , I will have to ask my grandchildren to show me how to do that.
